Gospel Reflection Veronica Lawson rsm

Most of the Gospel readings this year will be from Matthew. Matthew's Gospel invites us to read with attention to habitat as well as to the human and the holy. We need to realise that what we bring to the text will inform our reading of the text; it depends on our social and cultural contexts and on our capacity to bring our particular interpretive stance into dialogue with the worlds that inhabit the text. Jesus hears the news of John the Baptizer's arrest and "withdraws" to the safety of Capernaum in Galilee. Matthew thus grounds him in a familiar locale, and presents him as a light for a people who have lived in darkness and the

shadow of death and oppression. In the context of Roman imperial rule, Jesus offers the hope of an alternative reign. Jesus is our light. Jesus invites us to follow him, to join him on his mission to proclaim the reign "of the heavens". The verb "to follow" is an invitation to live out in our lives the pattern of Jesus' life. At times we need to distance ourselves from family expectations for the sake of the gospel. At times we have to decentre our material possessions even while we affirm the goodness of their materiality and their significance for the work of the mission. Great crowds followed Jesus; women, children, ministering to him.
