Join us online once or twice a week to meditate together. This form of silent, imageless prayer using a mantra or prayer word, is rooted in the gospel and the letters of St Paul and originated with the early Desert Fathers of the 4th century. A Benedictine monk, Fr John Main OSB (1926-1982), rediscovered this ancient prayer tradition for contemporary men and women. Today there are over 2000 Christian Meditation groups around the world. The 40 minute online meeting includes a short reading on meditation by John Main, Laurence Freeman, or other teachers in the Community, 20 minutes of silent meditation, followed by a question-and-answer/discussion period. 

Homily

The beauty of the Emmaus story is that it engages us all in all our humanity. It is also so wonderfully told that we are drawn deeply into the experience of the two disciples. We join them on their journey, a physical journey that becomes a journey of heart and mind and soul. We share their despondency, we feel the rekindling of their hope, we identify with their generous hospitality to the stranger, we are astonished by what is revealed to them, and we are filled with their exuberant joy.

Every time we hear this story we are summoned out of darkness into light, out of grief into gladness. We are invited into a world of generous hospitality – not the world of our limited efforts to welcome others but the world of unbounded divine hospitality to us.

Whenever we hear this story our eyes are opened to recognise that what happened at Emmaus is what happens when we meet for Eucharist: we gather, listen to the word of God, sup at the Lord's Table and go forth. This is the dynamic movement hidden in the static names for the parts of the Mass: Introductory rites, Liturgy of the Word, Liturgy of the Eucharist, Concluding rites. Would that we recognised the risen Lord in our breaking of bread and were impelled forth with the burning desire to share the good news with the world!

PRAYERS OF THE FAITHFUL

READER: Dear friends, on the way to Emmaus Jesus unlocked the scriptures for the two disciples, then revealed himself in the breaking of bread. As we long to be fed again from the tables of word and sacrament, let us pray for a world hungry for good news

READER: We pray for all who bring us hope and love and joy in this time of global upheaval. May they lift our spirits and call us together in solidarity

Lord, hear us.

READER: We pray for parents struggling with home schooling and for teachers at schools that are open. May they find the resources they need to meet these new challenges

Lord, hear us.

READER: We pray for the residents of aged care facilities. May they be well cared for as they suffer the pain of separation from loved ones.

Lord, hear us.

READER: Life-giving God, in the resurrection of your Son you have brought a new world to birth. Make us wholly new in your Spirit. We ask this through Christ, our risen Lord.
