THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY, MOTHER OF THE CHURCH

The Second Vatican Council presented the Virgin Mary in its document on the Church and in 1964 proclaimed the title Mother of the Church. Christ on the cross entrusted his mother to St John: This is your mother. The day after Pentecost, remembers her maternal presence among the disciples of Christ from the beginning.

The disciples devoted themselves with one accord to prayer with Mary, the Mother of Jesus.

As he hung upon the cross, Jesus said to the disciple whom he loved:

Behold your mother.

"I remember hearing how the mother's body is a baby's natural habitat. A baby knows its mother's smell, her voice,, the sound of her heart. It's why when a child runs to their mother, they are running to safety, to home, to their habitat of love.
