SAINT MARY OF THE CROSS

Mary MacKillop was born in Melbourne in 1842. Died in Sydney on this day in 1909. Took the religious name Mary of the Cross. Responding to the isolation of colonial families, she pioneered a new form of religious life to provide education for their children. She and her sisters shared the life of the poor and the itinerant, offering special care to destitute women and children. Remembered for her eagerness to discover God's will in all things, for her charity in the face of calumny, and for her abiding trust in God's providence. Australia's patron saint.

THE LORD'S DAY

St Ignatius of Loyola

The examen prayer, which St Ignatius asked Jesuits to pray twice daily, is a fundamental practice of discernment. It helps us to cultivate awareness of God's action in us and in our world, and to pay attention to our response.

Here is one way to pray the examen:

Gratitude: *I give thanks to God for . . .*

Insight: *I ask the Holy Spirit for insight into myself and the world . . .*

Reflecting: *I review events of the day, my behaviour, and notice my feelings . . .*

Noticing: *I notice what needs healing and ask God for forgiveness . . .*

Looking forward: *I name the action I feel called to now, and I ask for God's help.*
