## It's Nice, It's Different, It's Unusual

Last Tuesday, 29 September, a new Bishop was ordained for the South Australian Diocese of Port Pirie. And what was nice, different and unusual about the ordination? Well, rather a lot. The new bishop is Polish, a Salvatorian Father (a member of the Society of the Divine Saviour) who had worked as a priest in Australia for some 20 years. His name is Karol Kulczycki and he was unable to return from Poland for his ordination because of the COVID-19 epidemic. His episcopal ordination therefore took place in the Polish town of Trzebinia where the principal ordaining prelate was Archbishop Adolfo Tito Camacho Yllana, the Filipino-born Apostolic Nuncio (or main Papal diplomat) in Australia.

Bishop Kulczycki is not, of course, the first bishop of an Australian diocese to have been born overseas. The first Catholic bishops in Australia were English, and for a long time most were Irish. The late Bishop Joe Grech of Sandhurst was born in Malta; the present Bishop of Parramatta was born in Vietnam. Still, we think it fair to say that it is unusual that a priest in Europe should be asked to be a bishop in Australia – nice, different...but unusual.
