Open letter to the Premier from Catholic Bishops of Victoria

The Catholic Bishops of Victoria have released an open letter to the Premier raising concerns of unfairness in the numbers allowed for religious gatherings and have asked that the disparity be rectified urgently.

From Bishop Paul - Clergy Announcements

Recently the Diocese has started to announce clergy changes. So far Bishop Paul Bird, after the appropriate consultation, has made the following announcements. As you see there are implications for our parishes:

- Fr Shaiju is currently serving as Assistant Priest in the Cathedral Parish in Ballarat. His new appointment will be as Assistant Priest in the parishes of Mildura, Merbein and Red Cliffs, taking effect on November 28.
- Some time ago, Fr Michael Linehan asked if he might retire from the position of Parish Priest at the end of 2020. From January 1, 2021, the Parishes of Warrnambool West and Dennington will be entrusted to the pastoral care of Fr John Fitzgerald and Fr John Corrigan. This will be in addition to their care of the Parishes of Warrnambool, Koroit and Port Fairy. To highlight the team approach, I have nominated Fr Fitzgerald and Fr Corrigan as Co Pastors, with Fr Fitzgerald as the Moderator. This is in accord with the provisions of canon
- Fr Peter Hudson will be retiring as Parish Priest of Horsham and Nhill on December 27. I am pleased to be able to announce appointments to these parishes and neighbouring parishes to take effect following Fr Peter's retirement. Currently, Monsignor Glynn Murphy is Administrator of the parishes of Warracknabeal and Hopetoun. From January 15, 2021, he will become Parish Priest of Horsham and

Nhill and also of Warracknabeal and Hopetoun. At the same time, Fr Jim McKay, who is currently Assistant Priest in East Wimmera Parish, will become Assistant Priest in the parishes of Horsham, Nhill, Warracknabeal and Hopetoun.

- Fr Eugene, Parish Priest of East Wimmera, has indicated that he would like to move in the New Year to another parish requiring less driving. In anticipation of these moves, I now invite expressions of interest from any priest who would like to be considered for appointment to the East Wimmera Parish from January 2021.

- Following recent discussions about diocesan pastoral planning, I propose to appoint Fr Kevin Maloney as Diocesan Pastoral Development Coordinator, to be supported by a small panel. This coordinating role will be in addition to Fr Kevin's existing role as Vicar General. To enable him to fulfil these roles, he will conclude his current responsibilities as Parish Priest of Redan and Sebastopol and Administrator of Linton. In anticipation of this change, I now invite expressions of interest from any priest who would like to be considered for appointment to the parishes of Linton, Redan and Sebastopol.
