It's early evening. You are walking downtown in a large city. It's a few weeks before Christmas, and the streets are filled with people shopping. Your life has been so busy lately that you haven't had time to think about Christmas or shopping or anything related to the season. As you walk, you wonder why you even decided to come downtown tonight. You knew it would be crowded. You knew it would be difficult just crossing the street, but something drew you here, something that you felt deep inside.

A New Model for Governance in Catholic Education: https://ceob.edu.au/

Following consultation with the priests and many involved in Catholic Education in the Diocese of Ballarat, our Bishop, Paul Bird has announced a new approach to the governance of parish primary and secondary schools in our diocese.

The new model for school governance has emerged from a long-term project undertaken by a governance working party of the Ballarat Diocesan Schools Advisory Council (BDSAC). The working party, which commenced in 2012, has developed a model of school governance that will provide consistency and professionalism of governance for parish schools. It will also enable the continued pastoral ministry of priests in parish schools, without them being employers of staff. This latter point was one of the recommendations of the Royal Commission into Institutional Responses to Child Sexual Abuse.

In line with recommendations of the working party, the Bishop has established a company limited by guarantee, **Diocese of Ballarat Catholic Education Limited (DOBCEL)**, and appointed a board of directors to govern those parish schools where no priest is available for active governance and those parish schools where the parish priest elects (on behalf of the parish) to transfer responsibility for governance to the company.

On the 9th of December 2020 I formally signed over the responsibilities of Canonical Administration that I and my predecessors have exercised here in the Parish of Portland for 171 years. As of the 1st of January 2021 **DOBCEL** will assume responsibility for the administration of All Saint's Parish Primary School on behalf of the Parish.

I am very grateful to the Members of the Parish Pastoral Team, the Schools Advisory Council, Mrs Olga Lyons and the School Leadership Team, for their counsel over this time of transition. We are also indebted to Julie Duynhoven from CEOB for her assistance in preparing the Deeds of Transfer.

I am confident that this new era of Governance will free myself as Parish Priest to maintain a supportive spiritual and pastoral presence in our Parish Primary School in the years ahead.
