Bishop Paul Bird advises that he is now able to celebrate our 150th Mass on Sunday 5th December (not 28th November). Please note this date change.

For many years, roof tiles have been slipping and rain has been entering our building despite various costly attempts to fix this. It appears the terracotta tiles are no longer doing their job and after 60 years need to be replaced. We're open to cheap, quick alternatives to fix our dilemma. In the absence of these, it may be that replacing the tiles with colorbond is the best long-term option. While this will be expensive, it seems preferable to do this in the near future rather than be still wondering about this in say five or ten years time for much greater outlay plus the cost of water damage and maintenance in the meantime. Our parish finance committee is looking into this and this will be discussed at this week's parish council meeting. Our ideas are welcomed and very likely our generous donations toward this. THROUGHOUT LENT: We're asked to do penance – to interrupt the usual comforts of life, to rediscover in prayer the saving love of God, and to practice charity and justice towards those in need. We should carefully select the form of penance that we consider most appropriate for our own circumstances and growth in the Christian life. 1. Abstinence from meat, and fasting, are to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday for all who have completed their 18th year and have not yet begun their 60th year. All who have completed their 14th year are asked to abstain from meat. 2. On all other Fridays of the year including the Fridays of Lent, we're asked to do one of the following: (a) prayer – for example, Mass attendance; family prayer; a visit to a church or chapel; reading the Bible; making the Stations of the Cross; praying the Rosary. (b) self-denial – for example, not eating meat; not eating sweets or dessert; giving up entertainment to spend time with others; limiting food and drink so as to give to the poor. (c) helping others – for example, special attention to someone poor, sick, elderly, lonely or overburdened. Lent lasts from Ash Wednesday till the Mass of the Lord's Supper on 1st April. On Good Friday and, if possible, also Holy Saturday until the Easter Vigil, the Easter fast is observed.
