### Clergy and seminarians arrested in new crackdown.

Earlier this year, Cardinal Charles Bo of Yangon, Myanmar, President of the Federation of Asian Bishops' Conferences (FABC) asked that the entire week of May 23-30 be observed as a time of prayer for China. On May 20, Xinxiang Bishop Giuseppe Zhang Weizhu, 63, was arrested along with seven priests and 10 seminarians from the diocese under new regulations for religious activities that went into force on May 1. Those arrested were reportedly taken to a hotel where they are being held in solitary confinement and are undergoing so-called "political sessions" meant to instil the principles of the Chinese Communist Party.

### **ON THE RIGHT PATH – Fr Andrew Hamilton SJ**

As Reconciliation Australia notes in its review of the last 20 years, it also marks the growing number of ways in which non-Indigenous Australians have come to recognise the unique place of Indigenous peoples in our Australian story, and the further distance we must go if there is to be reconciliation.

The theme for 2021 is 'More than a word'. It points to the ever-present danger that words like reconciliation which express large hopes and commitments will turn out to be no more than words.

Reconciliation needs to be embodied in actions, in change of heart, in changed public attitudes.

On this feast of the Holy Trinity, I may begin my prayer by making a slow sign of the cross, taking the time to place myself in the presence of my triune God and physically acknowledging that all my prayer is to and for the three-divine person. I rest a moment in this awesome mystery.

What strikes me most? That I am a child of God? That I am loved, free and open to the intimacy of calling God 'Abba, Father'? How do I respond to this? With gratitude, with love, with silence...? Or maybe I can turn to the Spirit who strengthens my belief. I may wish to contemplate Jesus, the face and voice of the Father, whose love and love reveals the goodness of God to me. I speak to God from my heart. I may wish to draw my prayer to a close with another slow sign of the cross.
