God's law is about love



As part of a structured community or society, we need regulations, 'norms' or laws to provide the conditions for a productive, well-ordered and peaceful community. To achieve its mission and to continue to support people in their lives and with their faith, the Church also needs structures.

Church laws have been created by people of faith and good will over many centuries, based on the scriptures of the Old and New Testament and guided by the Holy Spirit. But, while there were times when Jesus found the application of the laws of his time not entirely to his liking, he never talked about simplifying or abolishing the laws.

He once said; "do not think that I have come to abolish the laws or the Prophets; I have not come to abolish them but to fulfil them" (Matt 5:17).

Yet, by answering the scribe's question in today's gospel, "which is the first of all the commandments?" Jesus gives us a clear picture that God's law is about LOVE. He sums up all the laws in this one word: LOVE. Jesus takes us to the heart of the matter because he realises that the observance of the laws has gone awry.


Jesus said to the scribe: "you load people with burdens which they cannot bear, and you yourselves will not lift one finger to help them" (Luke 11:46). Jesus highlights this so we understand that LOVE is at the heart of God's Commandments. It is love that is to permeate our actions and it is love that gives profound meaning to our lives.

It is love that moved God, like the Good Shepherd to go out and search for each one of us. He sent his Son to be one like us, even to the extent of giving his own life, dying on the cross and rising from the dead to give us a new life. Love led Jesus to obey his Father's Will and fulfill the plan of salvation.

Jesus has refocused us all on love and placed it as the heart of all God's commandments. Jesus thus invites us to have his love in our hearts and in our discipleship journey. This same love will enable us to live our faith with greater commitment and sensitivity in all our changing situations.

Let us remember that God's love continues to burn in our hearts as his Holy Spirit inspires and accompanies us on our faith journey. We are called to share this love with those around us, particularly the wounded, the troubled and the needy. May God bless you.

Dear Parishioners,

As per the Premiers statement on the 24th of October 2021, the Victorian Government has announced new COVID regulations to come into effect from 6pm on Friday October the 29th. I offer you a summary of the provisions that relate to gatherings in churches and how it will affect us in Portland at All Saints Church as they begin this weekend.

For those who are fully vaccinated or have a legal medical exemption, the new government regulations will permit gatherings of 1 person per 4 square metres indoors, or 1 person every 2 square meters outdoors with a cap of 500 people for each ceremony, according to the size of the Gathering space. For us here in Portland at All Saints Church, we can have 72 fully vaccinated people, including those required to assist the celebration at any Mass.

When vaccination status is unknown, the new government regulations permit gatherings of up to 30 people only for religious ceremonies indoors, with 1 person per 4 square metres. Vaccination status relates to those 16 years of age and older. For weddings and funerals, the regulations are the same as any other ceremony.

Mass will be celebrated in All Saints Church on Tuesday at 5.00pm, Wednesday at 10.00am, Thursday at 10.00am according to the cycles of readings & Prayers for week day masses.

Mass using the weekend cycle of readings & prayers will be celebrated on Friday at 10.00am, Saturday at 6.00pm and Sunday at 10.30am.

In line with the recommendation of Bishop Paul Bird, Friday Mass at 10.00am will be limited to 30 people so that that those who are not vaccinated may attend a Mass with Sunday readings and Prayers. This will commence on Friday the 5th of November. Masses on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday never achieve numbers over 30 so will also be open to all.

Thank you for supporting one another through these trying times. I offer special thanks to those who have assisted with gatherings in our churches over these past 18 months – those who have taken bookings for Masses, those who have helped us register as we have arrived at church, those who have done the extra cleaning throughout the pandemic. I ask you to continue to be patient as we negotiate the time ahead. Especially I ask you to be patient if you attend a gathering where we need to check vaccination status. Remember, those checking have not made the regulations. They are simply helping us to have as many people as possible attend Mass within the constraints of the government regulations.
