And many of them scolded him and told him to keep quiet, but he only shouted all the louder, 'Son of David, have pity on me.' Jesus stopped and said, 'Call him here.' So they called the blind man. 'Courage,' they said 'get up; he is calling you.' So throwing off his cloak, he jumped up and went to Jesus. Then Jesus spoke, 'What do you want me to do for you?' November 7 - Two Weeks to Go!

Principle: If everyone present is double vaxxed, we will be allowed to have 50 people in Stawell and Ararat. More than 50? The extras will be asked to go into the Hall in Stawell and the Parish Centre in Ararat. We will be able to have 35 in Landsborough and Lake Bolac. If we have unvaxxed people present, then that number (in all churches) drops to 20.

For those who are double vaccinated

From Sunday November 7, we will be able to have larger numbers of double vaccinated people at Mass.

To come to Mass parishioners will need:

- To be double vaccinated (1st jab received and the 2nd booked in will not be enough)
- To bring proof of vaccination (there will be no entry without proof which can be on your phone or on paper)
- We hope to keep a record of who is vaccinated to save having to bring certificates every time – stay tuned

How do I get proof of vaccination?

- Attend a Medicare office and ask for a printout
- Call the Australian Immunisation Register 1800 653 809 – they will post you a certificate
- Through MyGov / Service Victoria App / Medicare App

For those not yet double vaccinated

Government regulations will allow parishioners without vaccinations to come to Masses with fewer than 20 people.

You will be welcome at all of our weekday Masses and Masses in Landsborough.

Last weekend Lake Bolac had more than twenty, so they will be above twenty and proof of vaccination will be required.
