Dear Friends,

This Sunday marks the beginning of the season of Advent and a new liturgical year for the Church. Advent means 'coming'. It is Jesus who comes, not to bring despair and destruction, disaster and misery, but to dispel fear and anxiety in our hearts. The images used in the gospel are scenes from an eschatological language where good will eventually triumph over evil. They warn us against being disheartened. Let us ask ourselves and reflect on these questions, are we preoccupied with too much eating, drinking and partying? Are we obsessed with making money? Do we give a thought at all to Jesus and to our spiritual life? Jesus knocks at the door of our hearts. The season of Advent challenges us to welcome Jesus in the persons of other people, family members, strangers and friends, and to acknowledge his presence in our work, in our dealings with other people, even in our household tasks. We are reminded to pay attention to Jesus, to get busy with him and for him. Let not today's news about natural calamities, disasters, violence and wars prompt us to think that the end of the world is approaching soon. Let us not be deceived. We need not to be afraid. We may ask why? Because Jesus will come to liberate us from all the tribulations. His coming brings a message of love and leads us into his glory. Hence the season of Advent delivers hope that Jesus will come in glory. We have to be vigilant at all times to read the signs of the times and act accordingly to meet Jesus and enter into His glory. -Neville

### **COVID RESTRICTIONS UPDATE:**

From 11:59 p.m. Thursday 18th November 2021 the following restrictions apply to religious gatherings—if everyone present is fully vaccinated you can host or attend weddings, funerals and religious ceremonies at places of worship with no capacity limits or density limits.

If vaccination status is not being checked these events are restricted to one person per 4 square metres up to a maximum of 50 people per facility.

**Please note correction to previous information: There will also be mask requirements, density limits and caps in place for weddings, funerals, worship settings and other settings if the vaccination status of people attending is unknown, or not being checked.**
