




# St Patrick's Parish Stawell and Landsborough St Mary's Parish Ararat and Lake Bolac

### First Reading

[Dn 7:13-14](#)

A reading from the prophet Daniel

I gazed into the visions of the night. And I saw, coming on the clouds of heaven, one like a son of man. He came to the one of great age and was led into his presence. On him was conferred sovereignty, glory and kingship, and men of all peoples, nations and languages became his servants. His sovereignty is an eternal sovereignty which shall never pass away, nor will his empire be destroyed.

It is he who is coming on the clouds; everyone will see him, even those who pierced him, and all the races of the earth will mourn over him. This is the truth. Amen. 'I am the Alpha and the Omega' says the Lord God, who is, who was, and who is to come, the Almighty.

### Gospel

[Jn 18:33-37](#)

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John 'Are you the king of the Jews?' Pilate asked. Jesus replied, 'Do you ask this of your own accord, or have others spoken to you about me?' Pilate answered, 'Am I a Jew? It is your own people and the chief priests who have handed you over to me: what have you done?' Jesus replied, 'Mine is not a kingdom of this world; if

my kingdom were of this world, my men would have fought to prevent my being surrendered to the Jews. But my kingdom is not of this kind.' 'So you are a king then?' said Pilate. 'It is you who say it' answered Jesus. 'Yes, I am a king. I was born for this, I came into the world for this: to bear witness to the truth; and all who are on the side of truth listen to my voice.'



### Reflection by Dianne Bergant CSA

Each one of the readings depicts the enthronement of Christ who is revealed as the messiah-king. Until his trial, Jesus himself refused to be identified as king. The royal messianic expectations that prevailed during his lifetime were predominantly political. If he assumed them, his followers might have instigated a rebellion against the Roman occupiers. When finally he did acknowledge his royal identity, he insisted that his rule was not like that of other kings. Enthroned in heaven, Christ is revealed as the faithful witness to all that God has done and will continue to do. As first-born from the dead, his resurrection is the promise of our own resurrection. The dominion that he received from God is universal and exclusive and it will last forever. When he comes again on the last day, he will be revealed in all his glory. Christ's kingdom is a kingdom of truth and life, of holiness and grace, of justice and love and peace. We need not stand at a distance from him, afraid to approach because of our human vulnerability. He is the one who loved us so much that he handed himself over to suffering and death so that we might live. He has already brought us to birth in this kingdom through Baptism and he has taught us how to live in it. Today we look to that time when his glory will be revealed, when we will all be gathered into the embrace of God, there to sing praise to that glory forever.

Thanks to everyone who has already submitted an idea for a name for our new parish. You are very welcome to make more than one suggestion. Thus far the suggestions have been mostly about the geographical area. Consider also the religious or patronal name. What we need is a name for the new parish.

These are the suggestions so far:

- Grampians Parish / Grampians Gariwerd / Grampians Pyrenees / South East Grampians / Our Lady of the Grampians
- Lakes District Parish / Hopkins Parish
- Scullin Parish (Born in Trawalla, James Scullin was Australia's ninth prime minister and first Catholic prime minister)
- St Joseph the Worker Parish / All Saints Parish / Holy Communion Parish
- Exodus Parish, Gariwerd "Moses brought the people out to the camp to meet with God, and they stood at the foot of the mountain." [Exodus 19:17]
- The Parish of the Prophet Isaiah, Gariwerd  
"How beautiful on the mountains are the feet of those who bring good news [Isaiah 52:7]
- The Parish of Isaiah 61, Gariwerd  
"The Lord has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to bind up the broken-hearted, to proclaim freedom for the captives and release from darkness for the prisoners, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favour."
- Lumen Christi (Light of Christ), Djap Wurrong Country  
Our Vision; "We Aspire to be the Light of Christ in our World" The reason for including the Indigenous name is that, before Stawell, Ararat, Lake Bolac or Landsborough, came to be, this was Djap Wurrong Country. On 29 November, 1986, Pope St. John Paul 2, invited us, Aboriginal & non-aboriginal, to join together, when he said "You are part of Australia & Australia is part of you. And the Church herself in Australia will not be fully the Church that Jesus wants Her to be until you have made your contribution to Her life, and until that contribution has been joyfully received by others". By including Djap Wurrong Country in our name, we are taking the first steps in the long overdue process of reconciliation, something that should be more than just a word.



## Name for the New Merged Parish

The parish will comprise St Patrick's Stawell, St Francis of Assisi Landsborough, St Mary's Ararat and St Bernard's Lake Bolac. It is likely that St John the Baptist Beaufort will be included by 2025. The Combined Parish Councils will meet on November 24 to discuss your ideas. More consultation will follow.
