

Blessing of statue of St Patrick

Statue of St Patrick

Originally donated to St Patrick's Church in Rokewood in 1959 as a gift from John Leemon and Agnes Doyle in memory of their parents and sister, Margaret Mary Leemon, this sculpture of St Patrick is a rare example of high quality polychromatic work. Made in Fitzroy by Mattei Brothers, the statue is of plaster, reinforced with iron rods.

The iconography and symbols connected to St Patrick have often portrayed him as a bearded bishop with mitre, crozier and chasuble and holding the Bible. However, in this sculpture, St Patrick holds a church, a reference to his role in bringing Christianity to Ireland and building up the Church there during the 5th century.

His chasuble is usually marked with a cross but in this case, the statue has been painted with images of the

shamrock, a reference to

the tradition that St Patrick used the three-leafed shamrock to explain the doctrine of the Holy Trinity. The inner lining of the chasuble he wears is in the characteristic green of Ireland.

He is represented in this sculpture as standing on two snakes, an allusion to the tradition that St Patrick drove snakes out of Ireland.

that now stands in our cathedral.

Bishop Paul: Gracious God, we ask you to hear the prayers we offer and all the prayers that people offer around the world.
We make our prayers through Christ our Lord.

All: Amen.

Our Father:

Bishop Paul: We gather all our prayers as we say together the prayer that Jesus gave us.

All: Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. Amen.
