Dear Friends,

In the gospel we see Jesus resolutely determined to journey to Jerusalem. There, Jesus knows that he will meet his end and be taken up in glory. An incident shows the heart of Jesus when the Samaritans do not give them hospitality, James and John called "sons of thunder" by Jesus, show themselves deserving of their name by asking if Jesus wants them to call down fire from heaven to consume the Samaritans. Jesus does not agree. They just go to another village.

This event shows the wisdom of Jesus. We read in the book of the Acts of the Apostles, that later in history when the first Christians were persecuted and had to flee from Jerusalem, they took refuge in Samaria and were received by the Samaritans who became believers. We must not be angry at those who do not accept Christ. We must pray for them. God's timing is not always our timing. Let us wait for the time of God.

The second half of the gospel talks of different candidates for discipleship. Jesus deals with them individually, addressing different challengers to them. The call to be a Christian and to witness Jesus is not an easy call. It demands more commitment and dedication to the gospel than worldly desire. So let us pray to God to strengthen our faith to witness Jesus and to overcome the obstacles which ever may come in our witnessing life. -Neville

Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C

First Reading: [1 Kgs 19:16. 19-21](#)

A reading from the first book of the Kings

Elisha rose and followed Elijah and became his servant.

The Lord said to Elijah: 'Go, you are to anoint Elisha son of Shaphat, of Abel Meholah, as prophet to succeed you.'

Leaving there, Elijah came on Elisha son of Shaphat as he was ploughing behind twelve yoke of oxen, he himself being with the twelfth. Elijah passed near to him and threw his cloak over him. Elisha left his oxen and ran after Elijah. 'Let me kiss my father and mother, then I will follow you' he said. Elijah answered, 'Go, go back; for have I done anything to you?' Elisha turned away, took the pair of oxen and slaughtered them. He used the plough for cooking the oxen, then gave to his men, who ate. He then rose, and followed Elijah and became his servant.

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Galatians


My brothers, you were called to freedom.

When Christ freed us, he meant us to remain free. Stand firm, therefore, and do not submit again to the yoke of slavery.

My brothers, you were called, as you know, to liberty; but be careful, or this liberty will provide an opening for self-indulgence. Serve one another, rather, in works of love, since the whole of the Law is summarised in a single command: Love your neighbour as yourself. If you go snapping at each other and tearing each other to pieces, you had better watch or you will destroy the whole community.

Let me put it like this: if you are guided by the Spirit you will be in no danger of yielding to self-indulgence, since self-indulgence is the opposite of the Spirit, the Spirit is totally against such a thing, and it is precisely because the two are so opposed that you do not always carry out your good intentions. If you are led by the Spirit, no law can touch you.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

Jesus resolutely set his face towards Jerusalem. I will follow you wherever you will go.

As the time drew near for him to be taken up to heaven, Jesus resolutely took the road for Jerusalem and sent messengers ahead of him. These set out, and they went into a Samaritan village to make preparations for him, but the people would not receive him because he was making for Jerusalem. Seeing this, the disciples James and John said, 'Lord, do you want us to call down fire from heaven to burn them up?' But he turned and rebuked them, and they went off to another village. As they travelled along they met a man on the road who said to him, 'I will follow you wherever you go.' Jesus answered, 'Foxes have holes and the birds of the air have nests, but the Son of Man has nowhere to lay his head.'

Another to whom he said, 'Follow me,' replied, 'Let me go and bury my father first.' But he answered, 'Leave the dead to bury their dead; your duty is to go and spread the news of the kingdom of God.' Another said, 'I will follow you, sir, but first let me go and say good-bye to my people at home.' Jesus said to him, 'Once the hand is laid on the plough, no one who looks back is fit for the kingdom of God.'
