Dear Friends,

In the gospel we see that Jesus appoints and sends seventy-two in pairs to every town and place he intends to visit. He is the son of God, yet he desires to have collaborators in his mission. He has already chosen and formed a key group, the Twelve. Now he appoints sixty more collaborators. They went out for mission and came back rejoicing because "the demons were subject to us because of your name". 

Gospel: Shorter form Lk 10:1-9

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

Your peace will rest upon him.

The Lord appointed seventy-two others and sent them out ahead of him, in pairs, to all the towns and places he himself was to visit. He said to them, 'The harvest is rich but the labourers are few, so ask the Lord of the harvest to send labourers to his harvest. Start off now, but remember, I am sending you out like lambs among wolves. Carry no purse, no haversack, no sandals. Salute no one on the road. Whatever house you go into, let your first words be, "Peace to this house!" And if a man of peace lives there, your peace will go and rest on him; if not, it will come back to you. Stay in the same house, taking what food and drink they have to offer, for the labourer deserves his wages; do not move from house to house. Whenever you go into a town where they make you welcome, eat what is set before you. Cure those in it who are sick, and say, "The kingdom of God is very near to you."
