THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

First Reading: Hab 1:2-3; 2:2-4

How long, O LORD? I cry for help
but you do not listen! I cry out to you, "Violence!"
but you do not intervene. Why do you let me see
ruin; why must I look at misery?
Destruction and violence are before me;
there is strife, and clamorous discord.
Then the LORD answered me and said:
Write down the vision clearly upon the tablets,
so that one can read it readily. For the vision still
has its time, presses on to fulfillment, and will not
disappoint; if it delays, wait for it, it will surely come,
it will not be late. The rash one has no integrity;
but the just one, because of his faith, shall live.

Second reading: Beloved:

I remind you, to stir into flame
the gift of God that you have through the
imposition of my hands. For God did not give us
a spirit of cowardice but rather of power and
love and self-control. So do not be ashamed of
your testimony to our Lord, nor of me, a
prisoner for his sake; but bear your share of
hardship for the gospel with the strength that
comes from God.

Take as your norm the sound words that you
heard from me, in the faith and love that are in
Christ Jesus. Guard this rich trust with the help
of the Holy Spirit that dwells within us.

GOSPEL: Lk 17:5-10

The apostles said to the Lord, "Increase our faith."
The Lord replied, "If you have faith the size of a
mustard seed, you would say to this mulberry tree,
'Be uprooted and planted in the sea,' and it would
obey you.
"Who among you would say to your servant
who has just come in from ploughing or tending
sheep in the field, 'Come here immediately and take
your place at table'? Would he not rather say to him,
'Prepare something for me to eat. Put on your apron
and wait on me while I eat and drink. You may eat
and drink when I am finished'? Is he grateful to that
servant because he did what was commanded?
So should it be with you. When you have done all
you have been commanded, say, 'We are
unprofitable servants; we have done what we were
obliged to do.'"

Campion has launched a short introductory course on Western Civilisation that is open to everyone, regardless of age or location. “Introduction to Western Civilisation” offers a broad overview of some of the most important texts and ideas from the past 3000 years, including Plato’s Republic, Dante’s Divine and Nietzsche’s The Gay Science. The pre-recorded lecture series covers topics in the history, philosophy, theology and literature of Western Civilisation, derived from Campion’s Liberal Arts degree, and is designed to be taken at the student’s pace. The course content costs \$299 and is available for 12 months from the date of payment.
