Advent, Week 2

The October 2023 Synod of Bishops in Rome will face issues raised by the People of God throughout the World. The Bishops who serve us in the Oceania region will be part of this Synod. May they have a deep understanding of our concerns and represent us with dignity and courage. We pray to the Lord:

Advent, Week 3

We continue to pray for Pope Frances and our Oceania bishops as they listen attentively to the whisperings of the Holy Spirit. May they bring joy to your People, by their inspiration and loving care. We pray to the Lord:

Advent, Week 4

We pray ourselves, the People of God. Serving one another with joyful hope, may we grow in faith and love. With a profound respect for the variety of gifts that adorn us, may we each play our part for the good of all. We pray to the Lord:

The Nativity of the Lord

May Mary, Mother of the Body of Christ, embrace us with her maternal love. We ask that she place the mantle of your care over those chosen to serve as Bishops. Be their strength and comfort as they help to discern the way ahead for God's People. We pray to the Lord:

The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph

Jesus, Mary and Joseph, as a family, they protected one another. Be with those chosen and called to be guardians of the People of God. We pray especially for our Bishops in Oceania. Strengthen them to speak and act for the voiceless and powerless. We pray to the Lord:

Solemnity of Mary, Holy Mother of God

We give thanks for the truth and beauty of your creation. With our Bishops, preparing for this year's Synod, may we listen to the Cry of the Earth and the Cry of the Poor and work to be worthy of your many gifts. We pray to the Lord:

Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

As the Bishops of Australia, Papua New Guinea and the Solomons, the Pacific Islands and Aotearoa New Zealand make final preparations for their meeting in Fiji, that the Holy Spirit will fill them with wisdom and courage to accomplish their work on behalf of us all. We pray to the Lord:
