Fr Francis (Frank) Smith CSsR

20 November 1944: Frank was born at Colac Hospital, Victoria. He was educated first by the Mercy Sisters at St. Bernard's Primary School, Belmont then to St. Joseph's College, Newtown until year 8.

1958: Entered the Redemptorist Juniorate in Galong, NSW.

1962: Entered the Novitiate in Galong, NSW

11 February 1963: Took the first vows with the Redemptorist Congregation at the age of 18.

1963-1966: Studied at Ballarat.

2 August 1966: Professed his final vows.

16 March 1969: Ordained to the Priesthood by +James D. O'Collins in Ballarat Cathedral.

1970: Licentiate in Speech and Drama, Australia

1971: Licentiate Trinity College, London, teaching diploma.

1972: Became a Fellow of Trinity College London in Speech and Drama.

1973-1979: Lecturer in Creative Communication at Yarra Theological Union (Y.T.U) and became the head of the Department of Pastoral Studies for one year.

1972: Became involved with the Redemptorist Lay Mission Society which later became the Redemptorist Lay Community (RLC).

1972-1986: Was involved with the Ongoing Formation of the Melbourne R.L.C. by facilitating and developing weekend groups such as Alpha (for year 17-20 years olds), Genesis (for married couples), Exodus (for singles 21 and over), Good News (for anyone 17 and over), Pauline (for sole parents).

1979-1986: Did work in collaboration with Yarraville Mission Team and R.L.C. to reinforce the work of the missions in various places in Melbourne.

February 1987: Assigned to Perth.

19 July 1990: Frank's dream of establishing a mixed community of priests, religious and lay closer to the poor was realised as they opened a mission in Mirrabooka, Perth.

1997: Spent time overseas with a particular focus on experiencing and learning about community amongst the poor.

2000: Started the community at Heidelberg West.

2004-2017: Began the community at Wendouree, Ballarat.

February 2018-2023: Moved to The Redemptorist Community in Kew, Melbourne and began dialysis treatment.

28 March 2023: Admitted to Berengarra Residential Aged Care Facility, Kew.

2 August 2023: Died at Berengarra Residential Aged Care Facility, Kew.
