St Mary's Parish Care for Creation group and the Uniting Church are holding a monthly Repair Cafe in the hope we will restore items that would have ended up in landfill. We have started small with the early volunteers mending clothes, replacing zips, repairing toys and other small household treasures, sharpening garden tools and knives. We are hoping to have an electrician join our volunteers group to mend small household

Our Care for Creation group has been having informal conversations with a small group of local Aboriginal women - just listening to their stories and hoping to find

ways to have them feel more comfortable in our Parish community. They have offered to build an indigenous garden in our Parish grounds. We watched the <u>Documentary "The Lake of Scars"</u> together. It told the story of Paul Haw, from nearby Boort, who has collected an extensive array of very early Aboriginal photos & artefacts from the local area. He has them on display in a specially built small museum at his Boort property.


gy for the entire parish system.

As part of our action plan, the parish will be installing a plaque in the garden to acknowledge Australia's First Nation peoples. [St Brendan's also has a beautiful new statue of St Francis of Assisi awaiting installation in the garden.]

A Laudato Si' retreat was held during LS Week, and an eco-spirituality reading circle was launched at the end of the retreat.

The Earthcare Committee hosted a Zoom session on the upcoming Aboriginal Voice to Parliament, referendum featuring Professor Anne Twomey and Paul Briggs.

As a follow-up, the committee is planning a parish viewing of Fr. Frank Brennan's webinar,

which was part of the Victorian Social Services three-part series on the Indigenous Voice to Parliament that will be followed by a conversation guided by the Cardijn Institute SEE JUDGE and ACT brief enquiry.

We are facilitating NATSICC kitchen table conversations and planning Season of Creation activities.

The committee has been invited to participate in the Thresholds of Transformation (TT) journey as a pilot group, along with others, to assist in reshaping the TT journey for laity, which will be titled Seekers & Searchers

Laudato Si Week Film and Soup Night 2023

Friday evening 19th May at St Anthony in the Fields Church, Terrey Hills This first of 2 parish film and soup nights showing The Letter, was held on a Friday evening starting at 6.30pm with nibblies for those who needed them. About 50 people mostly from 2 of the 3 parish churches attended. It began with me doing our Acknowledgement of Country which is on a plaque in the church grounds. Kate and Annabella led the Prayer for Australia by our dear



friend, Yaegel elder, Auntie (Rev) Lenore Parker. They spoke briefly (Kate as a young Mum and Annabella as a uni student) about why The Letter interested them and their hopes for Laudati Si' action in our parish. After the film, people sat quietly and reflected, then wrote their brief responses on post-it notes to the following: What key message did you hear in the film? What change/growth in our faith are we being called to? What actions will this lead to in your home and in the parish? These were posted on a pin board under those headings and later collated.

Then everybody adjourned to our large country kitchen and yarned over some yummy soup and bread. We plan on having another session at another of the 3 churches on Friday evening 1st September to begin the Season of Creation and are really hoping to have more of the youth group join in this time. From that we hope to gather a larger more representative team to get moving on the LS Action Plan across the parish. A sample of the responses: We are at a very significant crossroads with climate change and care for our world; We cannot NOT KNOW!; Nature is screaming out in distress – and much of it is man-made!

SOUTH BELCONNEN from Megan

In the weeks leading up to Laudato Si' week, members of the LS Circle visited one of the primary schools in the parish. One visit involved a talk on biodiversity to Year 4 which was followed by planting out some native plants in the school garden. Another visit involved a presentation and discussion with Years 2 and 3 who were studying the solar system and how to care for creation. Their projects were displayed in the church foyer for a week. The teachers found the Primary School resources from CAFOD very helpful:

Laudato Si' animation for children (cafod.org.uk)

On Friday in Laudato si' week the year-groups, parishioners and some parents attended Mass. An indigenous cloth was used on the altar and a message stick was placed in front of the ambo. At the Offertory Procession, two First Nations children took up grapes and grain using a coolamon and dilly bag. The children read their own prayers of the faithful and sang the Laudato si' song from CAFOD at the conclusion of Mass. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=RTmdrPMEHKE The Mass was reported in the Catholic Voice.

Parish masses: Both churches were decorated with flowers, grapes and sorghum and colourful cloths. Our Parish Priest spoke of our responsibility to respond to "the cry of the earth and the cry of the poor." Prayers of the Faithful and appropriate hymns were selected. One of the LS Circle members spoke at each of the Masses announcing the release of the draft Parish Laudato Si Action Plan that had been developed. The draft plan is displayed at both churches and parishioners have been asked for their feedback.

Following Mass a guided walk was arranged at the Southern Highlands Ecosystems Park (STEP) in the National Aboretum.

An opportunity was provided at morning tea for parishioners to share their experiences of installing solar and/or of purchasing an EV with those who were considering doing so.



CATHEDRAL BENDIGO from Vyonne

Fr Brian spoke over 3 weekends in 3 churches about Laudato Si' and the document from the Vatican Dicastery & Swedish Science Institute 'Our Common Home'. Strong negative reaction in one church by 5 people but otherwise very well received. Our Diocese is launching the Season of Creation with the Bishop celebrating Mass in the Whipstick Forest followed by Picnic Lunch - for schools and parishes.



VICTOR HARBOR/GOOLWA from Fran

We are working at getting together a team around Earthcare. We have started with planning Seasons of Creation. A parishioner who lives in the middle town (Pt Elliot) between Victor and Goolwa has been good enough to

hold a series of meetings hoping to get the two churches working together. She arranges a shared lunch and the meeting takes place before, during and after lunch!!! I am hoping this group will persist after SOC. There is also a group of interested people who don't want to or are unable to come to meetings but we are aiming at keeping them "in the loop".

I am currently writing up the plan and hope to refine it through this group after SOC. A member of the group is also on the PPC and has agreed to present our progress at their meetings.


