

PRESENTATION & ELECTION OF CATECHUMENS

Presenter: Bishop Paul,

As Easter draws near, catechumens are completing their period of preparation. They have been strengthened by

God's grace and supported by their parish

communities' example and prayers. Now they request that after further preparation, they may receive the Easter sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and

Eucharist.

Bishop: Let those who are to be chosen for the Easter sacraments

of Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist be called.

Catechumens with their godparents / sponsors and parish delegate move to stand at the foot of the altar as their parish is named.

Presenter: Bishop Paul,

I present to you the catechumens proposed for election

by the parishes of

Bishop: The Church wishes to know whether these catechumens

are sufficiently prepared to be enrolled among the Elect for the coming celebration of Easter. Do their catechists and parish RCIA teams attest that they have received suitable instruction in the Gospel and are living it in

accordance with the tradition of the Church?

Presenter: Their preparation has been as varied as the catechumens

themselves, but on the recommendation of their parish

communities, I can assure you that they have been

given adequate formation.

Bishop: Godparents, I wish to ask you:

Have these catechumens faithfully listened to God's

Word proclaimed by the Church?

Godparents: Yes, they have!

Bishop: Have they responded to that word and begun to walk in

God's presence?

Godparents: Yes, they have!

Bishop: Have they shared the company of their Christian sisters

and brothers and joined with them in prayer?

Godparents: Yes, they have!

Bishop: And you, the Christian community gathered here, as

you have assembled to be with these catechumens, I now ask you to give an indication of your approval that

they now be invited to come to the Easter sacraments.

Assembly responds with applause.

PRESENTATION OF NAMES

Bishop: My dear catechumens, your godparents and catechists and this entire community have spoken in your favour.

The Church in the name of Christ accepts their judgement, and calls you to the Easter sacraments.

Since you have already heard the call of Christ, you must now express your response to that call clearly, and in the presence of the Church. Therefore, do you wish to enter fully into the life of the Church through the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist?

Catechumens: I do.

Bishop: Let the names of these Catechumens be called that I can

accept them as members of the Elect.

The presenter reads the names.

Presenter: These are the names of the Elect from the parishes of...

After the reading of names, the delegate takes the book to the Bishop to be signed and then returns to stand with their parish group. After all the books are signed, the Bishop then goes to meet the catechumens and their godparents. The parish delegate introduces the godparent to the Bishop and the godparent introduces the catechumen to the Bishop.

ELECTION OF CATECHUMENS

Bishop: My sisters and brothers,

I now declare you to be members of the Elect, to be initiated into the sacred mysteries at the coming

celebration of Easter.

Catechumens: Thanks be to God.

Bishop: God is always faithful to us;

now it is your duty, as it is ours, to be faithful to God in return, and to strive courageously, especially during Lent, to reach the fullness of truth which your election opens up for you. Use the time of Lent well, to prepare yourself through prayer, fasting and almsgiving, to experience what it is to die to sin with Christ, and to rise with him to newness of life.

Godparents, you have spoken in favour of these catechumens; place your hand upon their shoulder...


Each godparent places their right hand on the shoulder of the catechumen they have accompanied.


accept them now as chosen in the Lord.


Continue to sustain them through your loving care and example as they come to share in the sacraments of God's life.

After the Election of the Adult Catechumens concludes, the Presentation and Election of Baptised Candidates takes place.

PRESENTATION AND ACCEPTANCE OF BAPTISED CANDIDATES

Presenter: Bishop Paul,

I also present to you a group already numbered among the Elect by virtue of their Baptism. They now wish to participate fully in the sacramental life of the Catholic

Church.

Bishop: You who wish to be received and participate fully in the

life of the Church please stand, with your sponsors.

The candidates and their sponsors and the parish

delegates stand in their places.

Presenter: Bishop Paul,

I present to you these baptised candidates who now wish to participate fully in the sacramental life of the Church. They come upon the recommendation of the

parishes of....

The candidates, sponsors and delegates move to the foot of the altar as their parish is named

Bishop: The Christian life and the demands that flow from the sacraments cannot be taken lightly. Therefore, before granting these candidates their request to share fully in

the Church's sacraments, it is important that the Church

hear the testimony of their sponsors about their

readiness.

He addresses the sponsors.

Bishop: Sponsors, have they faithfully listened to the Word of

God and reflected sufficiently on the tradition of the

Church?

Sponsors: Yes, they have!

Bishop: Have they joined their sisters and brothers in prayer

and Christian community?

Sponsors: Yes, they have!

Bishop: Do you consider them ready and worthy to be called to

share with us at the table of the Lord?

Sponsors: Yes, I do!

Bishop: Let their names be called.

The presenter goes to the microphone and reads the names of the baptised candidates from the parishes.

Presenter: From the parishes of...

After reading the names, the delegate takes the book to the Bishop for signing.

After all the books are signed, the Bishop goes with the parish delegate to meet the sponsors and candidates. The delegate introduces the sponsors and the sponsors then introduce the candidate to the Bishop.

The Bishop now addresses the assembly.

Bishop: My sisters and brothers in this assembly:

You have gathered here with these candidates in their request to participate fully in the sacramental life of the Church. I now ask you to give an indication of your approval and support as we all move toward Easter.

Assembly responds with applause.

Bishop: My sisters and brothers, you are most welcome.

You have already been enriched by your Christian

Baptism, and I ask you to continue to allow its power to

unfold.

As the Elect are now to prepare during Lent for their initiation into the Church, I ask you:

Are you ready to join with them and the rest of the Catholic community in spending the weeks of Lent in prayerful preparation for the coming celebration of Easter?

Candidates: We are.


Bishop: Use this time of preparation well. Through prayer,


good works and fasting, prepare to renew your baptismal commitment at Easter. Take to heart the Word of God as proclaimed and lived by the Church, and at Easter come to be fed at the table of God's Word and at the table of our Eucharist with joyful and thankful hearts. maturity.

Bishop: We conclude with a prayer for us all.

you created the human race, and you are author of its renewal in Jesus Christ. Bless your adopted children: These Elect, these baptised people seeking full participation in the Easter mysteries, and everyone here present.

As true children of the promise, may all those numbered among the Elect rejoice in eternal life which is won not by the power of nature, but through the mystery of your grace.

We ask this through Christ our Lord.

All: Amen.

BLESSING AND DISMISSAL

Bishop: Blessed be the name of the Lord.

All: Now and forever.

Bishop: Our help is in the name of the Lord.

All: Who made heaven and earth.

Bishop: May Almighty God bless you, the Father,

and the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

All: Amen.

Bishop: Friends, God has chosen you in love and has called you

to renewal during this season of Lent. Seek the Lord and his strength; seek always the face of the Lord.

Go, in the peace of Christ.

All: Thanks be to God.
